Orchard art conquers the Venice Biennale

The Venice Biennale starts on April 20. Including: the orchard artworks from ArsCubis and Hochstamm Deutschland e.V. With a joint happening in the "Arena for a tree", the orchard world is celebrating the start of the International Orchard Day 2024. Orchard meadows at the Biennale: Art saves orchard, orchard saves art!

As part of the official opening program of the Venice Biennale 2024, the worlds of orchard meadows and art will enter into a symbiosis on 20 April. Art saves orchards, orchards save art: Hochstamm Deutschland e.V., the artist duo ArsCubis and the international orchard network celebrate the start of the European Orchard Day by bringing the two worlds closer together. On April 26, orchard heroes throughout Europe will present their passion at hundreds of events.

What connects orchard meadows and the art world?

Orcharding is an art, recognized as intangible cultural heritage by the German and Austrian UNESCO commissions and a formative cultural landscape all in one. It turns out that it is not only the fruit and the high biodiversity that inspire society and committed people. The cultural ecosystem services of orchards such as landscape, knowledge, traditions, festivals, etc. also offer an important approach to the topic. Throughout the ages, art lovers have found orchard fruit as a symbol in numerous paintings and myths. Even today, the focus is on orchard meadows as a cultural landscape, linking past and present.

On the way to the Biennale: orchard art inspires

The artist couple Achim Großmann and Silvia Eisele, alias "ArsCubis", create works of art from orchard apples and pears. The artists spend weeks collecting thousands of suitable apples and pears. They remove the grass, clean them and sort them by size. Then they dry them - sometimes for months. Using lightfast colorants and various coloring techniques, the artists transform the fruit. New, completely unexpected and impressive works of art are created, allowing for new interpretations and design possibilities. Großmann and Eisele compose up to 200 apples or pears into one wall object. The artworks also impressed the organizers of the 2024 Venice Biennale. The art world has now officially invited the couple to present their works there. The artworks will be on display at Palazzo Mora for the entire duration of the Venice Biennale until November 2024.

Orchard and art in symbiosis: Together at the Biennale

On the opening day of the Biennale, ArsCubis and the non-profit orchard-network Hochstamm Deutschland e.V. invite you on a voyage of discovery to the orchard meadows - right in the middle of the hustle and bustle of the lagoon city. The meeting point is the installation "Arena for a tree" by artist Klaus Littmann. Nestled against the backdrop of the historic Arsenale Nord, the temporary installation rises like an ark with a single protagonist at its center: the tree. On Saturday, April 20, 2024 from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., anyone interested will have the opportunity to experience orchard meadows with all their senses in this unique setting: orchard art in the form of "Ars apples", sounds, images, texts and samples from the orchard meadow. Do you want to be in Venice too? The orchard and art world is looking forward to a large orchard network on site. The participatory event <u>"Art Harvest: Art saves orchards - orchards save art - a symbiosis"</u> is also the start of the "European Orchard Day". The Europe-wide holiday for the species-rich cultural landscape shows how special orchard meadows are for many people, as a habitat and in culture.



Celebrate, protect and enjoy across Europe: The European Orchard Day

Valentine's Day honors love, the "European Orchard Day" honors the orchard heroes. All over Europe, people are passionately committed to the cultivation of orchards. They look after the meadows and trees, preserve old varieties and traditions and take care of the harvest to preserve the endangered ecosystems. Background information

Hochstamm Deutschland e.V.

Hochstamm Deutschland e.V. is a non-profit, nationwide association that campaigns for the preservation of orchard meadows. Hochstamm Deutschland is backed by orchard initiatives, local authorities, associations and private individuals. The aim of the association is to support friends of orchards in preserving the remaining orchards and to provide ideas for their further development - through networking, exchange and participation. Together with over 1.3 million supporters, Hochstamm Deutschland has managed to get orchard cultivation included in the national list of intangible cultural heritage in Germany. As a result, orchards are increasingly becoming the focus of public attention. Following this success, the international "Orchard Day" was launched by various initiators. Ars Cubis

The artist couple Achim Großmann and Silvia Eisele, alias "Ars Cubis", stand for composing the figurative as an abstract representation in a new way with a lot of knowledge, craftsmanship and a great deal of time. In recent years, Großmann and Eisele have increasingly focused on the orchards that characterize their adopted home of Calw. The artists spend weeks collecting and drying thousands of suitable apples and pears. The result is fascinating: hundreds of varieties of apples and pears, with all their fungi and bacteria, produce completely new surface structures after the drying process. The artists alienate the fruit using various coloring techniques. Up to 200 apples or pears are composed into one wall object. <u>https://arscubis.de/</u>


